

Ice Cream Soda Student Supply List

Paper Shapes and Acrylic templates: You have multiple options for purchasing supplies. Be sure you are ordering the correct size as the block comes in a small and large size.

- You can print out the paper templates from the PDF pattern onto cardstock and cut the shapes yourself (this is what I did). You will only need the Diamond, Kite, and Crown shapes for class; the Triangles won't be needed until you are ready to join all your blocks. Note that there are two block sizes; you may wish to print out both sizes before deciding which you wish to stitch. (I'm working on the larger blocks.)
- A variety of kit options can be ordered from Tales of Cloth.
- Paper shapes and acrylic templates can also be ordered from paperpieces.com, individually or as kits.
- Feel free to wait until class to decide if you wish to invest in the acrylic templates; you are welcome to borrow my templates at class.

Basic English Paper Piecing Supplies:

- Needles:
 - Milliner or Straw needle, size 9 for thread basting and tacking
 - Milliner or Straw needle, size 11 for whip stitching shapes together
- Thread:
 - Hand sewing thread for basting and tacking (I like to use a hand quilting thread.)
 - Superior Threads 60 weight Bottom Line polyester thread, or WonderFil 80 weight DecoBob thread in a neutral shade to match your fabrics for whip stitching
- Needle threader
- Thimble
- Fabric shears
- Small thread snips
- Paper punch for punching holes in the templates
- Sewline Glue Pen or small washable school glue stick
- Double stick tape is helpful if fussy cutting
- Clover Wonder Clips
- Reading glasses, if needed!

Additional Supplies:

- Rotary cutter
- Rotary cutting mat
- Rotary cutting ruler, small

Optional Supplies:

- Sue Daley's Fussy Cutting Mirror
- Sue Daley's Rotating Cutting Mat

Fabric Requirements:

This quilt uses optional fussy cutting techniques which makes yardage requirements tricky to calculate because the fabric needed depends on the size of the repeat and how many repeats you need! So, I would suggest purchasing enough fabrics for a few blocks or bringing an assortment of fabrics along to play with in class. No need to purchase fabric for the joining diamonds and triangles for class; you can purchase that later. Please refer to the pattern for more specifics on the fabric requirements.
